Rosenshine's 10 Principles of Instruction	Archer & Hughes' 16 Elements of Explicit Instruction
Begin a lesson with a short review of previous learning	1. Focus instruction on critical content
	2. Sequence skills logically
Present new material in small steps with student practice after each step	 Break down complex skills and strategies into smaller instructional units
	4. Design organized and focused lessons
3. Ask a large number of questions and check the responses of all students	Begin lessons with a clear statement of the lesson's goals
	Review prior skills and knowledge before beginning instruction
4. Provide models	7. Provide step-by-step demonstrations
5. Guide student practice	8. Use clear and concise language
·	Provide an adequate range of examples and non-examples
6. Check for student understanding	10. Provide guided support and practice
7. Obtain a high success rate	11. Require frequent responses

8. Provide scaffolds for difficult tasks	 Provide immediate and affirmative feedback
